WEST CARROLL CUSD #314: WEST CARROLL PRIMARY, MIDDLE and HIGH SCHOOLS AWARDED SCHOOL NUTRITION EQUIPMENT GRANT TO ENHANCE SCHOOL BREAKFAST PROGRAMS

The West Carroll Primary School and West Carroll High School in Savanna, IL and the West Carroll Middle School in Mt. Carroll, IL recently received \$ 10,544.00 in grant funds from Midwest Dairy Council, an affiliate of the National Dairy Council, for kitchen equipment to improve their school breakfast program and ensure all students have access to nutritious foods. Other Illinois schools that have implemented an alternative breakfast program such as Breakfast in the Classroom and/or Grab & Go, have seen an increase in student attendance, a decrease in school nurse visits and an increase in breakfast participation.

“We are thrilled to have been chosen as a recipient of the school nutrition equipment grants,” said Cindy Weems, West Carroll Food Service Director. “These funds will enable our district to provide our students with access to Breakfast in the Classroom for grades KG-6 and a Grab & Go option for grades 7-12. These breakfast models will give the nutrition staff the ability to increase number of meals each day reaching those students that do not or have not eaten school breakfast in the past.

Eligible school districts nationwide had the opportunity to apply for up to \$ 5,000 per school to support the purchase of equipment including utility carts, coolers, utensils, point of purchase equipment, etc. The West Carroll Schools were 3 of 93 to receive grant support via these funds in the Midwest Dairy Council region. The West Carroll schools applied for funds to purchase insulated coolers with travel carts for the breakfast to be delivered to grades KG-6. At the West Carroll High School a Cambro food bar that will be used for a Grab & Go breakfast cart will also be used as a salad bar at lunch time.

“Midwest Dairy Council’s dairy farm families have supported school nutrition for more than 100 years, and we are excited to support our local schools,” said Melissa Young, Vice President of Health and Wellness for Midwest Dairy Council.
